In addition, ASR provides professional development support to preschool teachers to increase their skills and competency levels in the Atwater Elementary School District.

The program will also work with service providers to develop cessation sustainability plans that can be integrated into their services.

(Breastfeeding Education, Support, & Technical Assistance)	\$30,745.25	Breastfeeding Education, Support & Technical Assistance (BEST) provides breastfeeding education, resources, training and support to medical and childcare providers. Breastfeeding classes to new and expecting mothers are also provided.
Golden Valley Health Center	Reach Out and Read	\$49,828.00	ROR provides books to children during the well-child visits and dental exams and trains medical and dental providers in the methodology to be effective in promoting literacy and reading with families as they provide each book.
Health Care Consortium	Consortium Children's Injury Prevention Program (CCIPP)	\$79,986.80	Consortium Children's Injury Prevention Program (CCIPP) will increase health care agencies' ability to provide pediatric injury prevention services. The program will also provide car seat safety classes and car seat safety checks to community families.
Livingston Union School District	Bright Beginnings	\$164,000.00	Bright Beginnings is a parent support program that utilizes the Parent as Teachers curriculum for home visitation, and provides parent trainings, workshops, and advisory meetings. In addition, Bright Beginnings provides professional development support to preschool teachers to increase their skills and competency levels in the Livingston Union School District.
Los Banos Unified School District	BRIDGES Project	\$167,963.00	The BRIDGES project will provide coaching and modeling to preschool teachers on the Westside of the county, as well as professional development opportunities, to increase teacher competencies and to improve skills in curriculum development, teaching strategies and classroom management.
Merced City School District	Families and Children Support Program (FCSP)	\$234,000.00	The FCSP provides a Positive Behavior Support specialist to support teachers by conducting health, social-emotional, and cognitive screenings; special services for identified children; and family workshops. In addition, home visits are conducted utilizing the Parents as Teachers curriculum for identified children in the Merced City School District.
Merced City School District	Teacher Support Program (TSP)	\$250,000.00	TSP is designed to complement the MCSD Family and Children Support Program by providing on-going training to improve teacher skills and coaching to provide modeling and continuous monitoring and feedback for preschool teachers in the Merced City School District.
Merced College Child Development Center	Raising Early-Intervention Awareness for Children's Health	\$106,430.00	In collaboration with Nursing and Child Development faculty, Raising Early-Intervention Awareness for Children's Health (REACH) will develop a curriculum to educate nursing and child development students about the importance of health and developmental screenings, service referral and early intervention services.
Merced County Community Action Agency	No Preschooler Left Behind	\$62,000.00	No Preschooler Left Behind provides preschool teachers within their program professional development opportunities and coaching support in order to increase teacher competency skills.

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Merced County Department of Public Health	Ready, Set, Go!	\$184,867.00	Nursing and Public Health staff will provide child health resource information and health consultation services in preschool and childcare settings, including health screenings and interpreting screening results.
Merced County Department of Public Health	Universal Developmental Screening for Merced County	\$91,701.00	Universal Developmental Screening program provides support to medical and mental health providers in the use of a universal developmental screening tool (Countywide). Providers are also made aware of current developmental information and available early intervention services.
Merced County Department of Public Health	Children's Health Initiative	\$267,998.00	This program enrolls children in public health insurance programs based on eligibility, including: Medi-Cal, Healthy Families and Merced Healthy Kids. Merced Healthy Kids enrollees also receive assistance in establishing a medical home.
Merced County Human Services Agency	Parenting Education Program	\$200,000.00	The Parenting Education Program provides educational parenting workshops and trainings for parents with children birth to 5 years old, utilizing the Positive Discipline Program and the Fatherhood Program.
Merced County Office of Education	Early Quality Improvement Project	\$264,916.00	EQUIP is designed to train and coach licensed and license-exempt family child care providers by adopting a bilingual ECE Permit Curriculum, assessing their environment utilizing the Family Child Care Environmental Rating Scale, provide peer mentoring and operate a home visitation program in order to provide resources and trainings.
Merced County Office of Education	Workforce Recruitment and Advancement Project (WRAP)	\$222,749	WRAP serves licensed and license-exempt family child care providers, and child care center staff to increase educational and professional growth through educational planning, advising, coaching and financial support.
Merced County Office of Education	BEAM-First 5 Preschool to Productivity Campaign	\$58,653.00	The BEAM Program works to increase awareness, advocacy and action in support of quality early care and education strategies and programs to business, government, and community organization executives in Merced County to recognize and articulate that providing quality early care and education programs is an investment with long term returns for children, families, communities and the economy.
Merced County Office of Education	Caring Kids	\$141,666.00	Caring Kids provides behavioral and social-emotional screening and early intervention services to children in the home and in educational settings. Trainings and strategies are also shared with the parents and providers in support of the child.
Merced Lao Family Community, Inc.	Hmong PAT Home Visiting Program	\$60,978.00	Utilizing the Parents as Teachers, Born to Learn prenatal to 3 years curriculum provide home visitation to Southeast Asian families with children ages 0-3 years old.
Planada Elementary School District	Readiness Is The Answer	\$85,100.00	The Planada RITA program provides home visits to families of children 0-3 years of age utilizing the Parents as Teachers, Born to Learn prenatal to 3 years curriculum.
Sierra Vista Children and Family Services	Early Mental Health Support Services for Children, Families and Providers	\$151,144.25	This program provides a continuum of community-based mental health services for children 0-5 years of age and their family including outreach and engagements, assessment and service planning, counseling and intervention, parent education and support, group support services for children, and case management and referral services.
